While we are all disturbed by what we have seen recently on the streets of Baltimore, please be assured that the Port of Baltimore remains open and is operating business as usual.

As you may know, the Port of Baltimore is located away from downtown Baltimore and away from the unfortunate incidents that we have witnessed. In fact, on Tuesday the Port of Baltimore experienced a very busy day at its public marine terminals. We had nine vessels, including one cruise ship, working that included 18 ILA gangs (approximately 1500 people). More than 3700 truck moves were conducted at our Dundalk and Seagirt marine terminals which is our daily average. CSX and Norfolk Southern conducted normal business at the Port of Baltimore. Our cruise operations handled 5,000 people with 12,000 pieces of luggage debarking and embarking their cruise ship.

The Port of Baltimore is a very unique port with a very unique geographic location. It is located one traffic light off Interstate 95, the main street of the U.S. East Coast. We are also the closest East Coast port to the Midwest. During challenging times for our city, we want to remind you that the Port of Baltimore is in Governor Larry Hogan's words "open for business", operating as normal and doing everything in our power to be the best port for your business.
